


The course material is extremely engaging, thorough, and diverse. Topics discussed were new, refreshing, and challenging.







She fostered a "lecture" environment which was more about collaborative learning than traditional lecturing, which was refreshing. I felt empowered as a student to share my opinions, and knew that she would fully take into consideration everyones viewpoints and contributions.

I like that Prof. Edell would open the class with a breakdown of the reading so that everyone could participate even when they did not understand the reading. Then, we would add our thoughts to the reading—we would garner a far deeper understanding of the reading this way. Instead of linear teaching, we would extrapolate beyond the text and really understand its fullness. It was like bringing together theory and reality.

Lectures were incredibly informative yet interactive at the same time which increased the students' energy and motivation. The classes could be seen as divided into two parts: lecture and discussion – Celia really beautifully blended these two learning methods.

Lectures were always super clear, and she did an amazing job moderating class discussions to help students engage with the material.

The lecture content was always fresh and insightful. Celia would lecture on topics that were very complex, but she always made sure to break them down into bitesize segments so I never felt lost or overwhelmed. I had not taken a feminist course at McGill prior to this, so I was tentative about signing up for pHIL 442, but I am so glad that I did!

Her method of teaching is exceptional! She uses a blackboard and chalk and focuses on discussion-based teaching which makes learning more effective.



Answers emails and questions thoroughly and fast!!


She was incredibly helpful during office hours and really great at discussing ideas for paper topics.





With such a specified topic such as the one in this seminar, readings were presented in a very cohesive and clear manner, and her class time explanations of the text really reinforced learning from individual reading. Professor Edell really encouraged students to think for themselves and not just mindlessly absorb the material, which I really appreciated!



With such a small class, it might have been interesting to incorporate some small team assignments throughout the term, however I felt that this type of learning was already present in class discussions so I enjoyed having less weekly assignments to worry about for this class.

I really liked that the midterm assignment challenged me to reflect on myself and relate course material to my own life; it made me think very deeply, much more so than I have for other philosophy prompts. And if deep thinking and reflection isn't the point of philosophy, then I don't know what is!

As well, this course did not demand incessant work; instead, it emphasized quality over quantity. This means that when it does come time for assignments, I felt motivated to do them well. I find that having a million little tasks to do every week makes it harder for me to engage in a class, and often ends up in me doing the bare minimum to finish the tasks. I liked the way the assignments were structured in this class.

I think the midterm essay was an excellent choice, especially for this kind of class.




Since much of the content was based in personal experiences of identity, I felt that more personal writing assignments were appropriately reflective of the content and goals of the course.

All weeks had a central topic of which readings were well related to (and built off of prior concepts,) and there was a nice balance of more accessible writing, and more advanced topics.

The readings were super interesting. I found the length to be appropriate. Again, when professors assign a manageable amount of readings per class, you get richer discussions because students actually do the readings. Some of the readings I found difficult to parse or I found slightly tangential to the course, but overall most were super interesting.

I thought the flow of the course really made sense. Starting with more individual aspects of ignorance, then seeing how ignorance can be understood as a more systematic, collective, social beast. Of course, this is simplified, but I think it really made sense looking back.

super interesting readings, great teaching methods, and overall an amazing course that I would recommend to any student.


Great reading materials, thoughtfully chosen and intellectually stimulating.

Readings were sufficient to learning the course content without being overwhelming. All time spent felt intentional and valuable.


